### FROM FATHER'S DESK

My Fellow Parishioners,

Fund raising was never taught during my seminary education. When I became a pastor I hoped that it would not become part of my vocabulary. However (as with my brother priests) I found that generating financial support is an essential part of ministry. Bidding parishioners to consider what they give to Christ's Church is part of my role as I serve His flock. In our families and daily life, we all must address finances as we look to the future. This is as true for a parish as it is for a home.

Currently, our parish weekly collection is not enough to meet our monthly operating costs. I can personally attest that each year, the Finance Council tries to be as conservative as possible when preparing the budget, but the economy can make it difficult to plan much more than a year in advance. This is where regular tithing can help. (Tithing is the practice of committing a specific percentage of income to the church over an extended period of time). Based on Christ's call, we have an obligation to ensure All Saints Parish will always be able to provide future ministries (as well as ongoing maintenance of our facilities) regardless of the state of the economy.

### Following lengthy discussion:

• We decided to implement an annual request that parishioners assess their weekly giving and decide if it is too much, just enough or too little, and respond accordingly.

• At all Masses the weekend of **November 4 & 5**, we will ask each parish household to make a specific commitment to weekly offertory giving.

• The activities on that weekend will stress the necessity of having every household contribute regularly, using electronic giving or through the use of your envelopes.

• We believe this will put us in a position where we can continue to grow as a parish community.

### Things to consider:

• Records show that over the past years, our Offertory has changed very little. Many of us developed our giving habits long ago, and continue them week-to-week. That's human nature.

• The annual process we will use does not so much ask for an increase in giving, but rather, asks each of us to consider what God has given to us and decide if what we return each weekend is enough, too much or not enough.

• Through prayerful reflection, each can then decide whether to increase, decrease or continue the commitment we are currently making.

• Statistics in the United States show that church giving is on the decline and that a decreasing number of people commit to giving regularly (tithing). I feel All Saints in Berlin can be different. So that *all* share in this responsibility it is important for <u>each</u> household to personally examine their financial commitment to our parish, based on how God has given to them. This responsibility falls on both those who are frequent in Mass attendance, or maybe-not-so-much. I pray everyone will be open to this request and accept the call to reflect on whether your financial gifts represent the blessings God has given you. Myself, Finance Council, Parish Council, and many others wish to see the parish continue to grow, but it can only happen with everyone's help.

To avoid misunderstanding or incorrect assumptions, please contact the parish office if you have questions about this program or the parish budget. Staff will be happy to assist you. God bless you all.
