# END OF YEAR PLANNING IRA DISTRIBUTIONS

#### Wondering what to do with your annual IRA distribution?

If you and your spouse are in your 70s, you may be eligible to make a gift to All Saints Parish and reduce your taxable income.

In general, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable in the year you receive them. One of the exceptions to distributions from traditional IRAs being taxable in the year you receive them are QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS. A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD) is generally a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an organization eligible to receive tax deductible contributions. ALL SAINTS PARISH is such an organization

This may be a great way for you to make a gift to your parish and: Avoid taxes on a transfer of up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the parish

Satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year Reduce your taxable income, even if you do not itemize deductions

Special conditions apply so please contact your tax advisor or plan administrator to learn more. The parish office can assist with information needed on required forms.
