### TEST YOUR LENTEN I.Q. . . . The Answers

- 1. Ashes are a symbol of penance. In the Old Testament times, people who were repenting of sin would fast, wear sackcloth, and sit in dust and ashes. Our use of ashes today is a small remnant of an ancient practice.
- 2. They are customarily made by burning the palms remaining from the Palm Sunday liturgies of the previous year.
- 3. No, there is no obligation to celebrate Mass on Ash Wednesday. However, celebrating Ash Wednesday is a wonderful way to begin Lent.
- 4. Ashes may be given to any baptized Christian, not just Catholics. Catechumens, because they are part of the Church, may also receive ashes.
- 5. The traditional answer is 40, but 40 is a symbolic number. There are actually 44 days in Lent, starting with Ash Wednesday and ending with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. The Sundays of Lent are not counted as days of Lent.
- 6. "Lent" literally means "springtime." It comes from an Anglo-Saxon word that means "lengthen" - the days are getting longer.
- 7. Lent always begins on Ash Wednesday for Roman Catholics, but for Eastern Rite churches it begins on the Monday of the seventh week before Easter (and ends the Friday before Palm Sunday).
- 8. Lent ends at sundown on Holy Thursday before the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper.
- 9. The three-fold discipline of Lent is prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This is really the discipline for all of Christian life, and we rededicate ourselves to it in Lent.
- 10. Catholics fast on Ash Wednesday and abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday & all Fridays of Lent. We also fast and abstain from meat on Good Friday.
- 11. In the first century, Christians abstained from eating the meat of warm-blooded animals on Fridays to honor Jesus' death on the cross on Good Friday. and we have continued the custom.
- 12. The Gloria and Alleluia are not sung during Lent.
- 13. Trick question! The baptismal font and holy water stoups should remain filled during Lent. Our baptism doesn't "go away" during Lent.
- 14. The liturgical color for Lent is violet (or purple).
- 15. Saint Francis of Assisi is believed to have started the devotion of the Way of the Cross in local churches.
- 16. The traditional number of stations is fourteen. That has varied over the year, and today some people add a fifteenth station (Jesus' resurrection).

BONUS - The earliest possible date of Ash Wednesday is Feb. 4, and the latest possible date is March 10.

### Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

The Divine Mercy of Jesus is a devotion to Christ associated with apparitions of our Lord to Saint Faustina Kowalska of Poland. The Roman Catholic devotion and veneration of the image speak of the unlimited love of God towards all people.

Pope John Paul II proclaimed it a Feast Day on the Liturgical Calendar of the Church, and from the devotion has come those powerful words: "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world! " and are contained in the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. While it is prayed all year long, they are especially so very fitting at this time of year as we focus on the passion and suffering of our Lord.

On the last 3 Sundays of Lent (March 10 /11,17/18, 24/25) we will be led in praying the Divine Mercy prior to Mass, as we normally would the Rosary. A booklet guiding us through the prayer will be made available to all who wish to participate. I understand not everyone is familiar with it , and perhaps not completely comfortable, but there should be no fret or confusion. The rosary will not be put aside - it will return Easter Sunday (and still be prayed on weekdays throughout Lent). Say it with me:

"For the sake of His sorrowful passion,

have mercy on us and on the whole world! "
