POPE FRANCIS ADDRESSES FAKE NEWS

In his message for this year's World Communication Day, which will be celebrated on May 13, Pope Francis wrote about the topic of fake news and the dangers of spreading it, reported CNS (Catholic News Service.) The theme for this year's day is "The truth will set you free.' Fake news and journalism for peace."

Fake news, the pope wrote, grabs people's attention "by appealing to stereotypes and common social prejudices, and exploiting instantaneous emotions like anxiety, contempt, anger, and frustration." He said that it is the responsibility of each individual to discern what is real news and what is helpful to share on social media.

At the end of his message, Pope Francis included a prayer that he wrote—based on St. Francis' peace prayer—as a guide for both those who report the news and those who read or watch it.

Pope Francis' Prayer for Countering 'Fake News'

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Help us to recognize the evil latent in a communication that does not build communion. Help us to remove the venom from our judgments. Help us to speak about others as our brothers and sisters. You are faithful and trustworthy;

May your words be seeds of goodness for the world:

Where there is shouting, let us practice listening; Where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony; Where there is ambiguity, let us bring clarity; Where there is exclusion, let us offer solidarity; Where there is sensationalism, let us use sobriety; Where there is superficiality, let us raise real questions; Where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust; Where there is hostility, let us bring respect; Where there is falsehood, let us bring truth. Amen.
