## 8 Reasons to Bring Your Child to Mass Regularly

- 7. Feed them on the journey. Our children will face many challenges in their lives. Jesus offers His very self to them to strengthen, encourage, and free them no matter what comes.
- 8. Help them find their true home. God longs for the whole family to gather around the table. In the Eucharist, we realize that we are all one in God.
