THOUGHTS ON LABOR DAY

Labor Day is a holiday that has been celebrated in the USA for over 100 years. For many, it means a 3-day weekend for camping, parades, and gatherings with family and friends. It also has come to signify the end of summer and the beginning of a new school year. But labor day, at its heart, was instituted to celebrate the workers and their achievements that built (and continue to build) this great nation.

Labor Day provides us all with an opportunity to reflect on our own work and it's place not only in this world, but in God's divine plan for each of us.

Jesus did not merely praise ordinary human work, but shared in it. He spent the vast majority of his life in Nazareth as a manual laborer. His fellow Nazarenes knew him as a "construction worker" (the Greek word teknon, in Mk 6:3, which has a meaning broader than "carpenter").

He called all his listeners, of whatever noble profession, to be saints. A few he called to leave their fishing boats or tax-charts behind to proclaim the Gospel. The vast majority he called to proclaim the Gospel by living that good news right where they were. That's still what Jesus does today. Most of his followers are called to live out their discipleship and apostolate, their vocation and their mission, in the family and in the workplace.

Work is not principally about earning a paycheck, but about serving and loving others. When work takes on this meaning, the perfection of the human person continues, the work-place is evangelized, and God's work is advanced.

On this Labor Day weekend, a diligent construction worker from Nazareth waves to each of us with calloused hands and says, "Come, follow me!"
