To the Faithful of All Saints Parish:

Following are excerpts from Bishop Morlino's letter of August 28, 2018 regarding the sinful activity that has taken place in the Church. I ask you to read it and strongly encourage you to join in the efforts that Bishop sets forth in his address. When done willfully and sincerely (not simply out of obligation) fasting combined with prayer can be a powerful thing. The call to all of us to pray and fast for the Church should not be taken lightly, and I humbly ask you to give it serious consideration. In this case "fasting and abstinence" would follow the guidelines we adhere to during Lent, but (as you are able) applied to the dates of **September 19, 21, 22.** (see footnote) God bless you in every way.

From Bishop's letter:

"....Finally, I ask you all to join me and the entire clergy of the Diocese of Madison in making public and private acts of reparation to the *Most Sacred Heart of Jesus* and to the *Immaculate Heart of Mary* for all the sins of sexual depravity committed by members of the clergy and episcopacy. I will be offering a public Mass of reparation on **Friday, September 14, the Feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross**, at Holy Name Heights and I ask all pastors to do the same in their own parishes."

"In addition, I ask that all priests, clergy, religious, and diocesan employees join me in observing ... **Sep. 19, 21, and 22** (traditionally known Autumn Ember Days) **as days of fasting and abstinence in reparation** for the sins and outrages committed by members of the clergy and episcopacy ... **and I invite all the faithful to do the same.** Some sins, like some demons, can only be driven out by prayer and fasting...."

"More than anything else, we as a Church must cease our acceptance of sin and evil. We must cast out sin from our own lives and run toward holiness. We must refuse to be silent in the face of sin...in our families and communities" <End>

Footnote:

Abstaining means eating no meat. (Milk, eggs, and fish are fine.) The practice of abstaining applies to Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting means eating only one normal-sized meal and two much smaller meals if needed, **with no solid food in between.** The practice of fasting applies to Catholics ages 18-59, except in cases of special medical conditions where fasting could harm them.

DO YOU KNOW THERE ARE 2 SPECIAL HOLIDAYS THIS WEEKEND . . . and neither one is well publicized!

On Saturday, Sep. 8, the Catholic Church recognizes the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In short, it's Mary's birthday! While her actual birthdate is not known for certain, the Church celebrates it on September 8 because it is nine months after the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is on December 8.

On Sunday, Sep. 9, our nation celebrates Grandparents Day. This holiday has been around since the late 1970's and is celebrated the Sunday after Labor Day Weekend. Grandparents certainly play an important role in our society, and deserve a special day. Pope Francis has called grandparents the "living memory of the family."

Here are a few ideas to commemorate these holidays: Bake a special birthday cake for our Blessed Mother and share a piece with a grandparent. Reminisce about times past, and ask about how Grandma and Grandpa celebrated special occasions.
