#### SAFETY COMMITTEE UPDATE

As you may know, a safety committee was formed this past summer and has been meeting to establish an Emergency Action Plan. The goal is to establish safety protocols and procedures to be followed in the event of an emergency. This includes things such as active shooter, dangerous weather, fire, etc.

One of the recommended actions put forth by the committee is a new policy on locking doors in the church building complex. The following recommendations have been approved by the Parish Council and will be implemented beginning Dec. 1st. As with any change, we understand this may require a bit of adjustment, and we will be posting signs several weeks before the change to help people get used to the new arrangement.

- Weekday Mass: Southwest church entrance and West (carport) doors will be open for Mass and relocked after Mass
- Weekday Office Hours: Southeast office/parish hall entrance will be open. All church side doors will be locked.
- Weekend Mass: Southwest church entrance and west (carport) entrance will be open for Mass and locked after Mass begins.
- Special Events: Doors for that particular area only (doors to social hall only or church side only depending on where the activity is taking place) will be open.

**SOUP SUPPER** - The Berlin United Methodist Church will be serving its Soup Supper on Tuesday, Nov. 6 from 4-7 pm. The menu includes a bowl of homemade soup, sandwich, slice of pie & beverage. Cost is \$7 for adults, \$3 for children ages 5-10 and free for children ages 4 and under.
