SELECTION OF A NEW BISHOP

It is hard to believe that it has been over a month since Bishop Morlino has passed away. Some may be wondering who will take his place, and how a new bishop will be chosen for us. For the time being, Msgr. James Bartylla is acting as Diocesan Administrator. The decision of who will be the new bishop ultimately rests with the pope, and he is free to choose anyone. But how does he know who to select? The process usually begins at the diocesan level, with bishops from the archdiocese of the province submitting names of candidates. (Madison falls under the archdiocese of Milwaukee.) The candidates are reviewed and voted on by the bishops at a province meeting. The names of candidates and results of the vote are then forwarded to the apostolic nuncio in Washington D.C. The apostolic nuncio is the pope's representative to our country, sort of like an ambassador. The apostolic nuncio does a thorough investigation of each candidate before submitting the list of candidates along with his recommendations to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome. The Congregation of Bishops then discusses the appointment and votes. The prefect of the Congregation of Bishops presents the results to the pope, who makes the final decision.

Once the Holy Father's decision is announced, it follows back down through the hierarchy to the apostolic nuncio who contacts the candidate to ask if he will accept. If the answer is "yes" the Vatican is notified and a date for the official announcement is set. The process of appointing a new bishop is not a decision that should be made lightly and it can be lengthy, often taking 8 months or more. Let us all pray for everyone involved in this process and may God send us a faithful, holy bishop devoted to Christ and His Church. Amen!
