Parish Elections - Your Church Needs You!



On the weekend of May 18th and 19th we will hold elections for Parish Council, Education Commission and Trustee.

<u>The Parish Council</u> meets once a month and assists the pastor in identifying, understanding, and implementing important matters that affect the life of the parish. Committees that stem from this include Liturgy, Building/Grounds and Social activities. With pastor's approval, they help take care of the details enabling the pastor to focus on pastoral matters.

<u>The Education Commission</u> meets once a month and is an advisory body which operates the various educational programs of All Saints Catholic Parish. This encompasses the Religious Education Program and the Catholic School, and is subject to the regulations of the Diocese of Madison. The purpose of the commission is to further the teaching mission of the Catholic Church by promoting various forms of Christian education that will serve the needs of our community.

Any parish member who is over the age of 18 is eligible to run for Parish Council, Education Commission, or Trustee. If you would like to submit your name to be placed on the ballot, contact the parish office for an application form.

Any youth of high school age, and active in the parish, who wish to be considered for the youth representative appointed by the Pastor, should reach out to Fr. David at the parish office and provide a brief explanation to why he/ she feels they should be considered for the one (1) school year term to serve on the Parish Council.

Please take note: Our parish collections are significantly less than our budget. The budget is based on what the parish needs to meet expenses. Due to this year's snow, ice and cold winter weather, the parish expenses are higher than anticipated – heat bill- snow and ice removal – repairs. Your parish has bills to pay, even if the winter weather did not allow you to safely come to a weekend Mass and place an offering in the collection. In reality, the Equality Act retracts religious freedom, endangers privacy, regulates speech, hinders quality health care, and threatens charitable organizations and those whom they serve. The Church seeks to promote justice and human dignity, and so Catholics are opposed to unjust discrimination. However, [in reality it] does not offer meaningful protections for individuals.
