PRO-LIFE NIGHT AT ALL SAINTS RECAP

On Thursday, June 20, All Saints Parish hosted a pro-life event sponsored by the Veritas Society of Wisconsin Right to Life. The evening started with Vespers in church, led by Fr. David. Fr. David prayed that youth would dare to take a stand and help set straight the terrible decision that allowed this culture of death to enter the fabric of our society. After prayerfully reflecting on the dignity of human life in the womb, and indeed all human life, attendees



moved into the parish hall for a light dinner provided by the CCW.

Amy Gehrke from WI Right to Life, spoke to the crowd of over 150 people about the work of the Veritas Society. The Veritas Society is the mass media program of the Wisconsin Right to Life Education Fund. Through its powerful TV commercials which run state-wide and through strategic Internet outreach, the Veritas Society targets women 18 - 35, those most likely to have an abortion. Since the Veritas Society began its television ad campaign in 1995, Wisconsin abortions have dropped more than 39%.

Our keynote speaker, Sean O'Hare, shared some of the influences that have motivated him to be active in the prolife movement. He grew up in a strong Catholic family that lived a very pro-life

lifestyle. Even though the term "pro-life" may not have been used, he saw his parents constantly taking in foster babies waiting to be adopted and pregnant women who needed a safe place to stay. Sean was also moved by the story of Brian Piccolo and Gale Sayers, both football players with the Chicago Bears in the 1960s. The two formed a close interracial friendship which broke down many barriers in that time period. Their example led to a better understanding of the equality and dignity of all life and stronger unity among all people. This theme of equality, dignity and unity was repeated with Sean's involvement with the special needs community. His connection with people with special needs began with a providential meeting with NFL player Tim Tebow. The Tim Tebow Foundation sponsors (among many other pro-life/pro-family causes) a Night to Shine. A Night to Shine is a prom held for those with special needs. Mr. O'Hare was invited to help with these events, and he was inspired to start his own special needs non-profit called *100 Million Strong*.

The prolife movement is about ending abortion, of course, but it is even more than that. It is about changing our hearts and clearly seeing the dignity of all human life, no matter what race, or ability, or whether that life is still inside the womb or not. Veritas Society events like these are held all across the state of Wisconsin.
