APPROPRIATE ATTIRE FOR HOLY MASS

Summer is here - bringing with it, the beautiful warm weather we've all been waiting for! And that usually means a different form of dress - casual and light is the order of the day. As we enter the summer months (and all year round really) I urge everyone - all ages to give careful consideration to what is appropriate for Sunday Mass. I think we'd all agree, Mass is a sacred event. We gather in a special place in the presence of God, and of one another to do the most sacred thing Catholics can ever do: Offer the sacrifice of Christ to God the Father. Such an event calls for the greatest degree of reverence both on the inside and out. A couple things to remember that may be helpful:

- It's said that our attitude on the inside is often reflected in how we dress and appear on the outside.
- Consider how you would dress to attend a family member's summer wedding?
- Or to a fine restaurant for dinner with important guests?
- The Holy Mass is far more significant than either of those! In the summer, "very short" shorts, cut-off jeans, tank tops, flip-flops or t-shirts with secular sayings are better saved for another place and time, not for the house of God.

Before setting out for church, it may be helpful to take a moment to pause in front of the mirror and ask: "Does what I'm wearing show due respect for where I'm going? What does it convey about my feelings of the Holy Mass?" Thanks for giving this consideration – you are wonderful people and I wish you a wonderful summer!

Note: Those who fulfill particular roles, such as Greeter/Usher, Choir Member, Music Cantor, or Minister of Holy Communion, should never wear the above mentioned items when helping in that capacity. Typically, parishioners in these roles have been very respectful about that, for which we are grateful.

The Scheduling of Mass Intentions

One of the great gifts we have is to celebrate the Mass not only for ourselves, the Church on earth (Church Militant) but for the souls of those who have died and believed to be in Purgatory (Church Penitent). Our parish is very blessed with the number of Mass Intentions that are requested each year. It's only June and our calendar is practically full, except for some weekday Masses throughout the remainder of the year.

In the last year, due to the high volume of Mass Intentions at All Saints Parish, some guidelines have been established to help provide equity and allow all parishioners the opportunity to schedule Mass Intentions. Additionally, the Diocese holds parishes strictly accountable for Mass stipends paid and recommends that parishes set limits so paid but unscheduled Masses do not become unmanageable.

Please note the following general guidelines: Each person may schedule ONLY ONE MASS INTENTION A YEAR Each family may schedule ONLY ONE MASS INTENTION A YEAR

(For example, a husband can schedule a Mass, a wife can schedule a Mass and the family could schedule a Mass which makes for a total of 3 Masses in a year)

When there is a death of a loved one, it is common that a family brings in multiple Mass Intentions which were given to them by family or friends. All Saints is able to accommodate **6 of those Mass Intentions** and will make every attempt to schedule 3 in the current year and 3 in the next year. To ensure every Mass Intention is honored, any additional Masses will be offered through the Diocese of Madison to retired priests or missionaries. However, when doing this, the date, time or place is undetermined. The family may also contact other local Catholic Churches such as Our Lady of the Lake in Green Lake, St. James in Neshkoro, or St. John the Baptist in Princeton to see what their availability is to schedule Mass Intentions.

Lastly, to follow the Diocese of Madison's 'best practice' recommendations, this bulletin and all future bulletins will only state the individual's name for which the Mass intention is being made. The Church teaches this is prudent for the following reasons:

- So that the intended recipient (deceased or living) receives the full attention and prayers from others, it is best to focus solely on the person or intention of the Mass and not who offered it.
- It can avoid bad feelings if it is noted that person 'A' had a Mass said for person 'B' but not for person 'C'
- It eliminates the urge to track the number of intentions given to one parishioner as opposed to another.
- Most parishes have a set # of intentions each person/family can request, and this helps to avoid any
 perception of favoritism.

If there are questions or you need further help in understanding the process, you may call the parish office and we'll be happy to assist you. We appreciate your help and understanding with the scheduling process.
