Living in the present moment: Holy leisure demands that we live in the present moment, disciplining our senses and awareness to be fully immersed in the NOW. Most of the time, the present moment is perfect!

When I feel anger, regret, fear, sadness, or anxiety, usually I have gone either to the past or the future. The Lord is always in the present! When God reveals His name to Moses, He does not say, "I WAS" or "I WILL BE." He says, "I AM."

A big part of my spirituality is trying to live in the present moment, attempting to put aside all distraction, so that I can be fully engaged with the people and tasks that are immediately in front of me. If I fail to do this and wander off to the past or future, I am missing out on my life and the wonder of what God is doing now.

My favorite spiritual book is *Abandonment to Divine Providence* by Jean-Pierre Caussade, a French Jesuit priest from the 17th century. In his writings, he speaks of the sacrament of the present moment as the place where God and His will for us is revealed.

We do not need to go somewhere else or be somebody else in order to obey the will of the Lord; we simply are called to do the task that lies before us now, whether that I going to work or school, finishing a project, cooking a meal, changing a diaper, or spending time in prayer. This living in the present moment frees us from undue anxiety about where God is or what He is calling me to do.



Everyone is welcome to come visit the school and see the classrooms and meet the teachers.



A few years ago, Father David envisioned having a modern kiosk in the gathering area where parish news, school news and announcements would be available. Today, thanks to the generosity and hard work of a parishioner, one now sits in the gathering space where it made its first appearance recently.

As you see from the above photo, there are 3 sides ~ One for **Faith Formation**, which will help capture the activities of our Catholic School and Religious Education at the parish. Another is for **Catholic Activities** such as events, retreats, and festivals taking place in nearby Catholic parishes and throughout the Madison Diocese. Come over and check it out ~ there may be an event coming up that you may want to attend. The third side is designed to help **Welcome New Parishioners** along with information on how you can keep connected to All Saints through our website and facebook page. Information is available on how to register and become part of the parish family- along with Stewardship and our newest Online Giving. You'll notice there's even an iPad where you can set up your Online Giving Account, which is rather effortless. Fr. David asks everyone to seriously consider signing up, as it makes life easier for you and helps to establish a steadier, more regular income for your parish.

The Kiosk was made with all the 'bells and whistles'- including track lighting and sleek overhead goosenecks to light up the information you'll find there. Along with the kiosk are some necessary guidelines that must be followed so it is used as intended:

- Please DO NOT post anything on the kiosk or put any of your own informational materials, pamphlets, or notices on, or in the kiosk. We ask that any and all materials be brought to the Parish Office for consideration and approval.
- Things that haven't been cleared by the office or Father will be removed. Unless you pin \$20 bills up there. Father said that is permissible. Haha.
- The iPad is intended only for accessing our All Saints Website. That includes looking at events, signing up for Online Giving, or even checking the Confirmation schedule! The device is blocked from such use as surfing the net, playing games, etc. (Sorry, kids)

We hope you'll routinely check the kiosk and see what it has to offer. Our intent is that you will find the Kiosk (along with the wall-mounted TV screen) a convenient way to view information about your parish. We are blessed with so many individuals - both men and women who are talented in various ways and willing to use it for Christ and his Church. This Kiosk is one example. We are grateful to them and the Creator from whom all good things flow!
