Reclaiming Sunday as a holy day of rest

I invite all of us to consider how we can better reclaim Sunday as a holy day of Sabbath rest. Worshiping God at Mass together, sharing a family meal, resting, reading and

praving, visiting a shrine or someone who is ill, and refraining from unnecessary work and frenzied activity are all ways that we can honor the Lord and embrace a holy leisure which humanizes, refreshes, and sustains us in the spiritual path.

How do we keep Sunday from simply being another day when we catch up on all the stuff we did not have time to do during the week? How do we keep our children's sports from becoming more important than the practice of our faith? For many of us, these questions may be difficult challenges, requiring prayer and discernment as we purposely surrender some of our schedule and activities.

Every day, I try to do nothing productive for a while. Whether it is watching a sunset, sitting in a chair, taking a walk, or riding my bike, I need a little bit of holy leisure to remember that being precedes doing and that prayerful contemplation, born of silence, peace, leisure, and stillness, is the highest human aspiration.

MISSIONARY PRIEST - Next weekend, Fr. Robert Kimbaleba will be with us to celebrate Mass and share with us some of his work with the Diocese of Kayanga, Tanzania. Please read the following information about the Diocese of Kayanga, and prayerfully consider how you might be able to help.

The Holy Father created Kayanga Catholic Diocese in August 2008. It is located in the extreme northwestern corner of Tanzania in East Africa where electricity and running water are, for the most part, unknown. There are no paved roads and a number of them are impassable during the rainy season. The Gospel was brought to this area about 100 years ago and rapidly the Church is taking roots. About 66 percent of the total population is Catholic. With such phenomenal growth in the faith goes the need for priests to minister to the faithful. The new diocese has been blessed with many young people who want to train for the priesthood. The challenge we have is lack of funds to meet the needs for the training. We are fundraising in order to establish a fund for the training of these young people who will be important agents of evangelization in the near future. Although seminary training is cheap in Tanzania, the new diocese is not able to meet all the needs for the big number of seminarians. It costs the diocese about \$30 to pay for school supplies for a seminarian in a month. Tuition is \$1,500 a year. Please find the enclosed envelopes if you wish to donate to this cause. Checks can be made out to All Saints Parish and dropped in the collection basket. Thank you for your generosity and your warm welcome to Fr. Kimbaleba.

Keeping Your Parish Updated

All dioceses require parishes to maintain accurate, updated records of their parishioners. In order to do that effectively, we need your help. Today parishes have computer software to help maintain their many records, but they are only as accurate as the information that's fed into it. Following are examples of when a parish should be informed of changes. This is not inclusive of *all* scenarios, but are the most likely to occur. ("Household" can be a single parishioner, a couple, or full family).

- 1. Address: Change in address (household moves to a new location and address, but remain members of the parish).
- 2. Phone Number: Change in phone number. (Today, many landline phones are disappearing, and household rely on cell phones only.)
- **3. Moving**: Household moves out of the parish domicile (geographical domain) of All Saints and joins another parish. When no longer belonging to All Saints, it is very important (and polite) to inform us.
- **4. Rest Home**: When a parent or family member moves into a rest home, assisted care center, or with other family members even if temporary, knowing this can help us visit and minister to them. If seriously ill, time may be of the essence.
- 5. Legal Caretaker: If it is determined by the legal caretaker that church mailings and correspondence should <u>not</u> follow the parishioner to his/her new residence, it is the responsibility of the caretaker to inform the parish office of that change. (For example, the caretaker may want it to continue to be sent to the former address, or to a P.O. Box, or perhaps to the caretaker's home address.) Given the 716 families (approx. 2,506 parishioners) you can imagine the number of different scenarios. Thus, it's necessary for the family or legal caretaker to inform the office of the change and how we are to proceed with mailings.
- 6. College Kids! Sons and daughters who leave for college are considered the greatest 'risk group' of drifting away from the Church. For our teens who spread their wings and go off to college, the Diocese has a program designed to help stay in touch with students and connect them to a Neumann Center or local parish. Does this guarantee our college youth will stay in touch with the Church as we hope? No, but it *does* offer hope and help, so even after they've left the nest, we can continue to live out our baptismal promises. Let's keep doing all we can in that regard. Please contact Michelle Wolff at our parish office for details.
- 7. Marriages: When children of parish families marry and set up their own home (the domestic church) in the All Saints domicile: When the couple is married here in the parish, this is likely to be addressed during the marriage preparation process. *Nevertheless*, it is prudent for the couple or their parents to help ensure that establishment of a new home address occurs.

As you can see, there are numerous avenues to keep track of. We are a very mobile society! We appreciate your help in keeping church files as accurate as possible. They may not always be "absolutely perfect", but together we will try our best. May it please God!
