

Bishop Hying is a 'huge fan' of Catholic schools

On August 7, signs of a new school year about to get underway were apparent. An all-principals meeting for administrators in the Diocese of Madison Catholic Schools was held at Edgewood College in Madison.

Bishop Donald J. Hying of Madison spoke to all of them in the morning. He told the principals, "I am a huge fan and proponent and promoter of Catholic schools." Bishop Hying added, "I want you to know, right away, straight out, that I believe in Catholic schools – and I think they're a beautiful way to [teach] faith in our young people and to create a culture of life and of learning and of faith...any way that I can be supportive, I'd love to do that."

The bishop remarked that he has set a goal to visit all the more than 40 schools in the Diocese of Madison in his first year as bishop.

'What is it that we're all about?'

Bishop Hying, together with the principals, reflected on the question "What is it that we're about?"

He answered that question, saying that the mission is to give young people an "intense love for God, a great connection to Jesus, and a sense of the mission that comes to us when we embrace the Gospel."

As a guide to that mission, he referred to Matthew Kelly's book *Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic.*

The first sign is a commitment to daily prayer. This can be praying every day at the same place or the same time, praying with Scripture, the Rosary, meditation, and other forms.

"As Catholics," Bishop Hying said, "we talk a

lot about prayer...we don't always teach people how to pray." He added that "we have been anointed by people in our lives who prayed for us, and hopefully have mentored us in prayer... consistent, stubborn dedication to prayer."

Another sign is at least 15 minutes a day studying and learning the faith, such as watching a video, reading a book, or attending a lecture. Bishop Hying said a concern in education is some Catholics "stop growing" in their knowledge of the faith after they are confirmed. He equated it to taking a computer class in 1982, not learning anymore since, and trying to cope with modern technology.

He reiterated that there is "excellent catechesis" in Catholic schools, but many people "don't have the confidence" to give good answers to faith questions.

Another sign of a "dynamic Catholic" is that one is generous in love and service to other people. Bishop Hying said these are people that "go the extra mile and ask, "what can I do?" versus "what do I have to do?" "Our goal of our Catholic schools is to create an environment and create a culture where it's the most natural thing in the world for our children to fall in love with God," he said. "When we're in love with God, we give our all," he added.

A final sign is to evangelize without realizing that's what he or she is doing. "How do we ourselves become more intentional disciple makers?" Bishop Hying asked.

He responded, "you as principals, you really set the tone" of being a witness to students and "walking toward the Lord, leading all of these people that you work with, and serve, and teach."

Serving the principals

Bishop Hying concluded his time with the principals by asking them what are their concerns and challenges going into the new school year. Following his talk, Bishop Hying celebrated Mass for the principals in the St. Joseph Chapel on the Edgewood College Campus. Following Mass was lunch, and Bishop Hying helped "bus" the tables where the administrators were seated.
