

MASS BOOK NOW OPEN FOR 2020 - You are welcome to schedule Masses or sanctuary lamp for 2020. In an effort to provide equity and give all parishioners an opportunity to schedule Mass intentions, we ask that people follow these general guidelines: Each person can schedule one Mass intention per year, and each family can schedule one Mass intention per year. (For example, a husband schedules a Mass, a wife schedules a Mass and together as a family they schedule a Mass for a total of 3 Masses for this two-person family; a one-person family could schedule a total of 2 Masses.) We also limit sanctuary lamps and weekend Masses to one per family per year. Mass stipends are \$10 and the Sanctuary lamp is \$5. Thank you.
