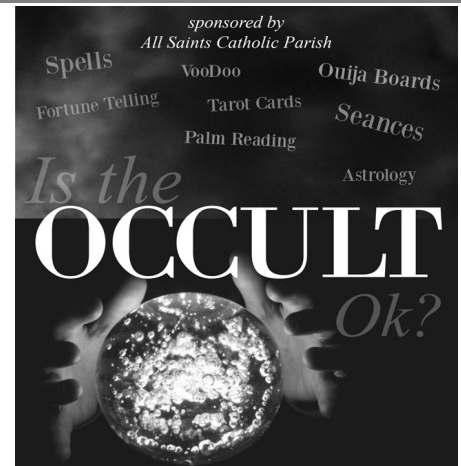
## Is the Occult OK?

## All Saints Religious Education Volunteer Opportunities

We are in need of volunteers. YOU are very important to our program! It has been a long tradition at All Saints that our parish family has offered their time and talents. It is through caring, sharing, and praying that our parish community has grown in love and support of one another. The success of our religious education program depends on the dedicated individuals in our parish willing to share their time, talents and faith with our parish children who are the future church. We encourage all our parishioners, as well as parents of children in our program to help out in some way. We are always in need of catechists, classroom aides and substitute teachers. We are currently looking for substitute teachers for all grade levels and adult classroom aides for our Middle School Religious Education and Confirmation Programs.

### VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS

Catechist: *“These words I am commanding you today are to be upon your hearts. And you shall teach them diligently to your children and speak of them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as reminders on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorposts of your houses and on your gates.”* (Deut 6:6-9). *The Mission of a Catechist* is such an important one. It is a mission that has been given to the whole Church: that every individual Christian shares in the work of Jesus Christ. *The Role of a Catechist* is to bring our young people closer to Jesus and grow in their faith as Catholics. Through their service the catechist nurtures and mentors the faith and spiritual growth of the children they teach so that they may form a firm commitment to follow Christ. *Qualifications of a Catechist:* A catechist must be at least 18 years old, a practicing Catholic in good standing who attends weekly Mass regularly, has a love for children, the desire to grow in faith and share that journey with young people, the ability to relate well to others, a sense of humor and flexibility, and a willingness to be of service to the Church.

Adult Classroom Aides: Volunteers are needed to assist in the classroom every week and possibly substitute for the teacher when needed.

Substitute Teachers: Volunteers are needed to fill in for teachers when absent.

Teen Aides: Volunteers who are in 8th grade through High School are needed to help out in the classroom every week.

## Making Your Home a Domestic Church

In *Familiaris Consortio*, Pope John Paul II's apostolic exhortation on the role of the Christian family in the modern world, the pope speaks about the family as a "domestic church". This is what he says:

"An important purpose of the prayer of the domestic Church is to serve as the natural introduction for the children to the liturgical prayer of the whole Church, both in the sense of preparing for it and of extending it into personal, family, and social life.

Hence the need for gradual participation by all the members of the Christian family in the celebration of the Eucharist, especially on Sundays and feast days, and of the other sacraments, particularly the sacraments of Christian initiation of the children... Likewise, the Christian family will strive to celebrate at home, and in a way suited to the members, the times and feasts of the liturgical year. (61)"

So I want to reflect just a little bit upon some of the ways in which we can try to live this out in our homes, how we can make our home into a domestic church. And this is really at the heart of creating an authentic Catholic culture. It begins in the home. And there are basically two things that I think are fundamental to culture—to human culture in general, and to Catholic culture in particular. And that is, I think the culture of a home is crated and sustained by prayer and by food: the family prayer time and the family meal time. You've heard the saying, "The family that prays together, stays together." But if the family isn't even eating together, they're probably not praying together.

**Fasting and feasting-** So let's talk about food! And not just because I like food (although I do). The liturgical life of the Church is built upon cycles of feasts and fasts that are designed to insert us into the mysteries of Christ. So these feasts are important for us, but feasting doesn't mean as much if it's not preceded by fasting. Think of agricultural societies, where those lean months before the harvest are what really make the big harvest festival so exciting. And in a similar—though much higher—way, it is the sorrow of the cross that leads to the joy of the Resurrection. This cycle of fasting and feasting, which is this natural human way in which the supernatural reality of the Cross and Resurrection is impressed upon our lives so that it becomes second nature to us, is repeated on a weekly basis as well as seasonally and annually.

**Weekly cycle** - What is the weekly cycle of fasting and feasting? It's the Friday penance and the Sunday dinner. Traditionally, the Friday abstinence from meat and the Sunday roast. If we've lost a little bit of our sense of Sunday as the Lord's Day, as a day of worship, rest, and joy in the Resurrection, then we ought to ask ourselves whether this is because we've lost our sense of Friday as a day of penance in remembrance of Christ's passion and death for the sake of our salvation.

How many Catholics know that Fridays throughout the year are still supposed to be observed as days of penance? If you're a Catholic and you eat meat on a Friday throughout the year, you are supposed to do some other act of penance to substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat? Now I will admit that's hard to remember. But you know what's easier to remember? Just not eating meat on Fridays.

And then on Sundays, of course, Mass is the first priority. But then the next priority should be the Sunday family dinner. If you can have dinner as a family every [day], that's even better, but if not, at least make sure you do on Sundays. And try to make that Sunday dinner a little more special, something that your family will look forward to. In my home we at least try to make sure we have a nice dessert on Sundays. What are your Sunday family traditions?
