## **Tune in to This for a Moment**

Along with the many other worthy causes, the music department would like to establish a fund to replace our sanctuary piano when the time comes. This beautiful instrument generously donated by the Hank Derleth family has served us so well; we are blessed to have it! Nevertheless, it is over 80 years old now, and in the near future will very likely not respond well to tuning—which of course is essential for quality sound.

By “near future” we are thinking about 5 years, at which time it would have to be replaced. Five years may sound far away, but an instrument of this nature is costly (a used grand piano is roughly \$10,000) so we feel it’s wise to begin a fund now.

Anyone who feels led to contribute to this is welcome to do so. Please mark your check or envelope for “Piano Fund” and it will be reserved for this purpose only. A donation for the memorial of a loved one is also an option. It’ll accompany the liturgy of the Holy Mass for many, many years to come.

### Baptism
