### Announcing the Retirement of Jane Munro after many years of Dedicated Service

After 24 years of dedicated service, Jane Munro has announced her retirement from her position as Administrative Assistant at All Saints Catholic Parish. She began working as a full time church secretary at St. Michael’s Parish in 1996 with Father Richard Lesniak. When reminiscing with Jane, she remembers when she shared the front office space of the rectory with him. “It was a small space, but a lot happened there!” said Jane.

She recalls when Father Max answered the call of Bishop William Bullock to serve the Catholic community of Berlin when Father Lesniak retired. She worked every day until noon updating the bulletin, posting collections, scheduling Mass Intentions, and answering phones. By afternoon, she worked on the flower gardens around the church.

So much has changed since then as the parishes were linked and the new church was built and dedicated on the hill in July 2007. Jane helped transition the parish into the new church space by maintaining daily operations alongside Pat Wirtz. She had the opportunity to help pick out office furniture and make the office space what it is today.

Jane has remained an active and very busy member of our parish over the last 24 years. She has been an active member of the Catholic Council of Women and the Columbia Northwest Vicariate, serving also as chair, secretary and as a past and current President of the CCW. If only one had tracked her volunteer hours over the years from the many occasions she assisted or chaired committees for the church festivals, church rummage sales, Harvest Dinners, Bingo, Blood Drives, and funeral luncheons. Some of her favorite memories during these past two decades have been spent helping here at the church making pazekis, coordinating the Baby Shower for Jesus, the Donkey Project and Soles for Souls project.

Don’t worry, Jane plans to continue to volunteer and remain active in groups and parish activities. So even though she might not be in the office or answering phones, you will still see her friendly smile as she continues to offer her help and experience in many different ways at All Saints Parish. We’d like to thank Jane for paving the way with all the work she has done, and continues to do for our parish. Enjoy your retirement, Jane!
