LENT

This week we begin another season of Lent. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season - a time on the Church calendar observed with prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Not that those aren't important or practiced during the rest of the year, but Lent calls us to focus on these ever more intently, as we turn our eyes towards the cross and the Passion of Christ.

During Lent it is also common to 'give something up' to set aside something that we normally might enjoy. The practice began back in the 3rd century when the Church was still in her infancy. While meager and inadequate, these personal sacrifices are to remind us of Christ's forty days of sacrifice and temptation in the desert. Followed by a journey that would one day end at Calvary with the ultimate sacrifice - a sacrifice made, not because he had to, but because he wanted to. A sacrifice that opens the gates of heaven and the opportunity for eternal life!

It's difficult to think of eternal life without thinking of the mortality and the brevity of this life. Ash Wednesday is a somber reminder of that reality. It hits home as the priest rubs ashes on our forehead and says those brief, yet powerful words: "Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return". ~Fr. David Greenfield

A Reminder about Fasting and Abstinence in Lent

Abstaining means eating no meat. (Dairy, eggs, and fish are fine.) Abstaining applies to Catholics age 14 and older. Fasting means eating only one normal sized meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal, and no solid food between meals. Fasting applies to Catholics ages 18-59, except in cases of special medical conditions where fasting could harm them.

- Abstaining from meat is required by the Church on <u>all</u> Fridays during Lent.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fasting and abstaining.
