NEW WINDOW IN CHURCH NAVE

Notice anything new? Look to the east when you first enter the church nave and you will see an amazing new window. While the windows of our church are designed to look out over God's landscape, there have been many comments/suggestions to find some type of covering for this particular window. The huge utility boxes are necessary but not pleasing to the eye, especially when we enter the House of God. Many solutions have been discussed - always with the idea that we please God and maintain the aesthetics of our worship space. A window that complimented the window in our confessional has been the best proposed solution.

Thanks to a very generous donation from the estate of a deceased parishioner, the idea for a window became a reality. We found a window in St. Michael's Oratory whose style is similar to the window in our confessional, it was in excellent condition and able to be restored. The window depicts St. Therese of Lisieux. She is often remembered as the "little flower of Jesus". St. Therese entered the Carmelite convent in Lisieux, France at age 15. She died in 1897, at the age of 24, after a long struggle with tuberculosis. She was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 17, 1925. In her autobiography, "*Story of a Soul*" she wrote,

"what matters in life is not great deeds but great love".

We are thankful for our generous benefactor that made this window possible.

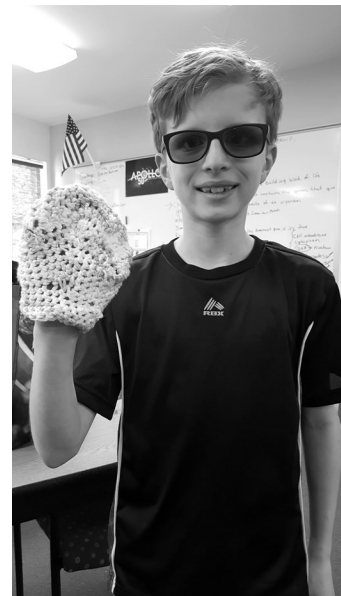
All Saints Catholic School office hours are Monday through Friday 7:30am - 3:30pm.

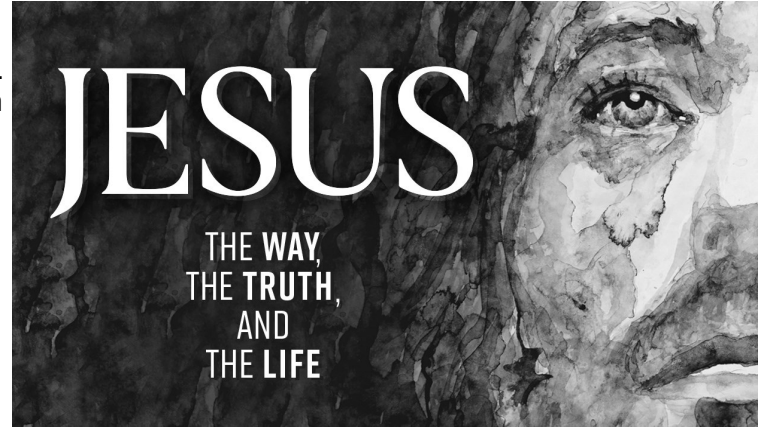

Stations of the Cross



**"We adore you O, Christ, and we praise you",
"For by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world".**

Walking or praying the *Via Dolorosa* (the "Way of Sorrows") is a Christian tradition stemming way back to the middle of the 4th century. And still today, with great solemnity, we commemorate Christ's path to Calvary through the 14 Stations of the Cross. At each, prayers are said in unison and a reflection correlating to that particular station is read. During this Lenten season, we invite you to come and "walk" the Stations of the Cross on Wednesdays at **All Saints Catholic Church**, and on Fridays at **St. Michael's Oratory** (All Saints Catholic School location.) You do not have to be a Catholic to experience this tradition or pray the prayers. Likewise, there may be Catholics who wish to reacquaint themselves with this holy tradition of Mother Church. Regardless of where one is in their faith journey, it can be profoundly instrumental in preparing oneself for the coming of Holy Week and the commemoration of Christ's Passion. So we invite you to come, see where the *Via Dolorosa* might take you....

A Reminder about Fasting and Abstinence in Lent

Abstaining means eating no meat. (Dairy, eggs, and fish are fine.) Abstaining applies to Catholics age 14 and older. Fasting means eating only one normal sized meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal, and no solid food between meals. Fasting applies to Catholics ages 18-59, except in cases of special medical conditions where fasting could harm them.

- Abstaining from meat is required by the Church on all Fridays during Lent.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fasting and abstaining.
