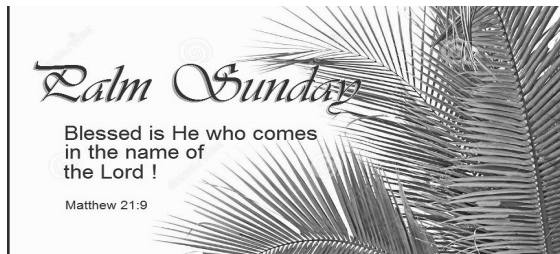

Due to the continued concerns regarding COVID-19 and to comply with orders from the governor and our bishop, we are suspending all large group gatherings until further notice.

Church Office - We are changing our office hours in order to minimize contact between people. Our office **will not** be open to the public, but will be minimally staffed Tuesday-Friday, from 8 AM - noon, to take phone calls and support parishioners. We will still be regularly checking emails and voicemail as well as updating our website and Facebook pages so we will stay in touch with all of you. Be safe, stay well.

Private Prayer Time - The church will remain open for private prayer. We ask that you use the hand sanitizer at the entrance and remember that there is a **limit of 9 people** in the church at a time. It is very important we abide by this rule. This also applies to confession times on Wednesday evenings from 4:30 - 6:30. Please note that on Wednesday this week, there will likely be some activity in the church from 11 - 1, as Fr. David and a few others will be doing some necessary set-up and practice for live-streaming the upcoming Holy Week Masses. On Good Friday, the church will only be open from 8 - 11 AM.

Blessed Palms

We will have blessed palms available to pick up during open church hours, and we will keep some palms aside to be available after the "Safer at Home" order is lifted for those who would rather wait. If you choose to pick up blessed palms before the "Safer at Home" order is lifted, we kindly ask that you limit touching the palms as much as possible. In these times of great uncertainty, we encourage everyone to practice patience, kindness, and obedience, in imitation of Jesus and our Blessed Mother.

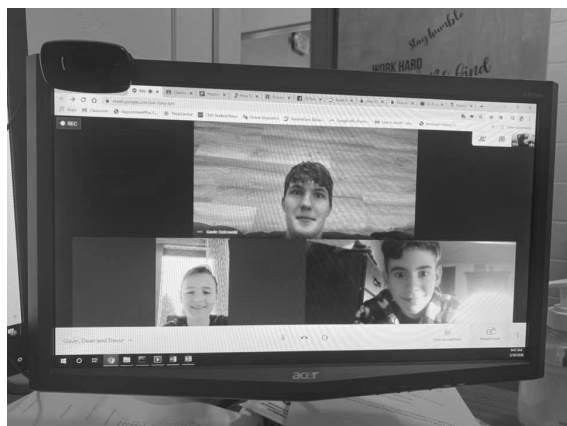
What's Happening at ASCS?

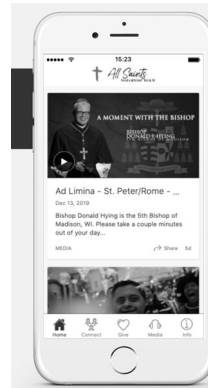

The Meaning of Colors

Colors play an important part in the liturgical year of the Catholic Church because they can create an immediate, emotional connection with the meaning of an event. There are many celebrations and observances in which color is used as part of the symbolism. However, the seasons of Lent and Easter are particularly rich in the use of color.

Holy Week

Holy Week is the week leading up to Easter Sunday beginning with Palm Sunday. Throughout Holy Week, Christians follow the footsteps of Jesus beginning with His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem and ending with His death on Good Friday. Palm Sunday's color is red and, even though this Mass commemorates Christ entering Jerusalem in triumph, this color foreshadows His death on the cross on Friday. Later in the week on Holy Thursday white is the color of vestments and the altar because it is a time of joy as this liturgy relives the Last Supper, the foundation for today's Mass and formation of the priesthood. Once Holy Thursday (also called Maundy Thursday) is completed, the mood changes and moves to a time of remembrance of Christ's crucifixion, death, and His body being laid in the tomb. The color on Good Friday is red, symbolic of the blood Christ shed for our sins. Since Mass is not celebrated on Good Friday, altars are stripped bare to symbolize the emptiness of our lives in anticipation of the Risen Lord who is to come on Easter.

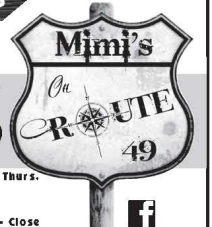
