PARISH PRESS

This weekend we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. One of the wonderful things about this feast is the promise our Lord made to St. Faustina that, *“I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy”* (Diary, 1109).

Pope St. John Paul II declared Divine Mercy Sunday a universal feast of the Church in 2002 and also attached a plenary indulgence to it which ties to the promise.

Included on the next page of this bulletin are some guidelines from our diocese regarding the indulgences associated with this feast in light of the current, unusual circumstances.



Divine Mercy Sunday, April 19, 2020

This weekend we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. One of the wonderful things about this feast is the promise our Lord made to St. Faustina that “I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy (Diary, 1109).” John Paul II declared Divine Mercy Sunday a universal feast of the Church in 2002 and also attached a plenary indulgence to it which ties to the promise. Here are some guidelines from our diocese regarding the indulgences in light of the current, unusual circumstances.

Divine Mercy Sunday & Coronavirus Diocese of Madison Prepared: 4/16/2020

There are two indulgences connected with the Divine Mercy

- 1) The indulgence recently granted by the Apostolic Penitentiary, available here <http://press.vatican.va/content/salastampa/en/bollettino/pubblico/2020/03/20/200320c.html> requires no special accommodations: a plenary indulgence can be obtained by anyone who recites the Divine Mercy Chaplet to pray for the end of the epidemic, for relief for the afflicted, and for eternal salvation for the dead (along with the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer according to the Holy Father’s intention, as soon as possible).
- 2) The indulgence promulgated in 2002 in relation to the Divine Mercy devotion is a bit more complex. Already in the grant are accommodations for hardship or impossibility. From the decree, the conditions for the indulgence are:
 1. A plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g., “Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!”)
 2. A partial indulgence, granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation.
 3. For those who cannot go to church or the seriously ill, in addition, ... the sick and those who nurse them; and all who for a just cause cannot leave their homes or who carry out an activity for the community which cannot be postponed may obtain a plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, if totally detesting any sin, as has been said before, and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, will recite the Our Father and the Creed before a devout image of Our Merciful Lord Jesus and, in addition, pray a devout invocation to the Merciful Lord Jesus (e.g., “Merciful Jesus, I trust in you”).
 4. If it is impossible that people do even this, on the same day they may obtain the plenary indulgence if with a spiritual intention they are united with those carrying out the prescribed practice for obtaining the indulgence in the usual way and offer to the Merciful Lord a prayer and the sufferings of their illness and the difficulties of their lives, with the resolution to accomplish as soon as possible the three conditions prescribed to obtain the plenary indulgence.

Practically speaking, then, to obtain this 2nd indulgence, one must fulfill one of the following:

(A) taking part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy (specific prayers or devotions are not mentioned), OR

(B) reciting the Our Father, the Creed, and another prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Both need to be done on Divine Mercy Sunday, and both need to be done at a church or chapel. Certainly, in front of a church or chapel building, in the church or chapel parking lot, or on church property but outside the church or chapel is “at” the church or chapel in a moral sense. (The faithful can prudently judge for themselves whether they are unable to go to a Church or are otherwise impeded from obtaining the plenary indulgence as mentioned above.)

AND The faithful must also fulfill the three usual conditions (confession, Communion, prayers for the intention of the Holy Father) or, as permitted in the bishop’s recent decree, at least have the intention of fulfilling them as soon as possible while having contrition for their sins.

EVENTS

Church Office - Our office **will not** be open to the public, but will be minimally staffed Tuesday-Friday, from 8 AM - noon, to take phone calls and support parishioners. We will still be regularly checking emails and voicemail as well as updating our website and Facebook pages so we will stay in touch with all of you. Be safe, stay well.

Private Prayer Time - The church will remain open for private prayer. We ask that you use the hand sanitizer at the entrance and remember that there is a **limit of 9 people** in the church at a time. It is very important we abide by this rule. This also applies to confession times on Wednesday evenings from 4:30 - 6:30.

Blessed Palms - We will have blessed palms available to pick up during open church hours, and we will keep some palms aside to be available after the "Safer at Home" order is lifted for those who would rather wait. If you choose to pick up blessed palms before the "Safer at Home" order is lifted, we kindly ask that you limit touching the palms as much as possible.

Parish Elections will be postponed until a later date when we are able to hold the public celebration of Mass and everyone has the opportunity to vote. The elected members whose term is up have agreed to graciously extend until we can hold elections. For now we would like parishioners to consider being part of the parish council or education commission.

- The Parish Council meets once a month and assists the pastor in identifying, understanding, and implementing important matters that affect the life of the parish. Committees that stem from this include Liturgy, Building/ Grounds and Social activities. With pastor's approval, they help take care of the details enabling the pastor to focus on pastoral matters.
- The Education Commission meets once a month and is an advisory body which operates the various educational programs of All Saints Catholic Parish. This encompasses the Religious Education Program and the Catholic School, and is subject to the regulations of the Diocese of Madison. The purpose of the commission is to further the teaching mission of the Catholic Church by promoting various forms of Christian education that will serve the needs of our community.

Any parish member who is over the age of 18 is eligible to run for Parish Council, Education Commission, or Trustee. If you would like to submit your name to be placed on the ballot, contact the parish office for an application form. Any youth of high school age, and active in the parish, who wish to be considered for the youth representative appointed by the Pastor, should reach out to Fr. David at the parish office and provide a brief explanation to why he/ she feels they should be considered for the one (1) school year term to serve on the Parish Council.


