## Statement from Bishop Donald J. Hying, regarding peaceful protests turned violent in Madison, WI this weekend

"Over this past weekend, what started as a peaceful protest against the horrific killing of George Floyd in Minnesota, quickly devolved into rioting and looting in downtown Madison by some. I join my voice with those of Madison Mayor Satya Rhodes-Conway, area alders, and other leaders calling for calm and peace as we as a community work for justice in a positive and proactive way. I ask all people of faith to pray and act for peace and unity. In these days after Pentecost, we pray that the Holy Spirit will pour out His graces, especially justice and mercy, which are much needed in our country at this critical moment.

All people of good will mourn with the family of George Floyd and all who have lost loved ones to injustice and violence. While peaceful protest is justified, violence against others and their property is not. In a culture of anger, conflict, pain and suffering, only the love of God can truly transform hearts and minds, as we seek human flourishing and the common good.

Racism is always a sin. Our society can and will, by the grace of God, overcome the injustices with which this sin infects our community, if we stand together proclaiming the dignity of every human person, created in the image and likeness of God, and together build a culture of life in which every person is welcomed, respected, and loved.

I thank our civic leaders, police and firefighters, National Guard and all citizens of good will who have heroically responded in difficult and often dangerous circumstances to protect precious lives in our local community. Everyone has our prayers and support."

## News and Announcements

#### **Resumption of Public Masses - What to expect:**

The following excerpt from Bishop Hying explains his rationale and approach for return to public Mass: "Given the lifting of civil restrictions in most counties of our diocese, some may ask why we are adopting a gradual approach to reinstituting Masses with significant restrictions present. The answer lies in the fact that COVID-19 cases continue to emerge in the state and there is still a very real danger of infection without adequate care; therefore, we want to be prudential in light of public health concerns. To simply emerge from these weeks of physical distancing without any gradualism would be irresponsible. Our hope is that our elderly and at-risk faithful people will exercise prudence in attending Mass - especially given the current dispensation from the Sunday obligation. But we do want to begin enabling people to participate in the Eucharistic sacrifice, the central experience of Catholicism, which we have all sorely missed in these challenging weeks of the pandemic."

#### Weekend Mass

- The recommendation that has been given all along still applies: If you do not feel well, think you may have been
  exposed to the virus, have an immune system that is already compromised, or still feel uncomfortable being with large
  groups, stay home. The dispensation given by the Holy Father and the Bishop is still in place and permits one to be
  absent from Mass for a justifiable reason. We will also be livestreaming the 10:00 Mass on Sunday for those who wish to
  stay home.
- We are required to limit capacity to 25% of the church occupancy limit, which equates to 162 parishioners.
- We will be adhering to social distancing guidelines of 6 ft. Parishioners are free to wear masks if they wish, but must provide their own.
- Enter the church through the carport doors. This is necessary to keep a count of people as they enter.
- As difficult as this is, please be understanding if the capacity has been reached prior to your arrival and you are asked to attend the next Mass. Remember the dispensation from Pope Francis for truly not being able to attend remains in place.
- There will be a hand sanitizing station located at the entrance. Please sanitize as you enter. We also encourage you to bring your own pocket sized hand sanitizer if you have one available.
- Please follow the signs and usher's instructions as you enter church. Seating must take place immediately there can be no congregating or clustering in the gathering space before or after Mass.
- Enter the worship space through the doors that are propped open.
- Seating will be in every other pew. Pews will be marked with tape with 6ft. social distancing in mind. Obviously, families and couples of the same household may sit together with no spacing. Outside of that, 6ft. spacing should be maintained.
- Touchable things such as missalettes, chairs, pamphlets, etc, have been removed.
- If you need to leave the worship space during Mass, please exit through the doors that have remained propped open.
- The one single use bathroom will be open for use by both genders. There will be disinfectant wipes and basic instructions in the bathroom.
- There will be no singing by the congregation. All singing will be done by the cantor.

#### **Holy Communion**

- Father, Deacon, and the Eucharistic Minister will be distributing communion. They will be required to wear face masks.
- They will come to you, please remain in your pew.
- It is strongly recommended that you receive communion in the hand.

#### **Departing after Mass**

- When Mass is over, an usher will dismiss the assembly pew by pew, starting in the back.
- Please follow the signs to exit the worship space and the gathering space through the front (south side) doors. If you are using a wheelchair or walker, you may exit out the car port side doors.
- Please note you will not be able to congregate in the gathering space after Mass. We ask that you keep the line moving as you leave. Feel free to talk in the parking lot after Mass is over.
- If you would like to receive a printed bulletin, ushers will be handing them out as you exit your pew.

Weekday Mass - Please follow the guidelines for weekend Masses, following the social distancing guidelines of 6 ft.




