Increased Attendance Allowed at Holy Mass

As of Monday, June 15, Dane County moved into "Phase II" of reopening. This means that many businesses and organizations, including churches, can increase gathering sizes to 50% of their maximum capacity, and Bishop Hying is giving churches in the diocese permission to do the same.

Please keep in mind that 50% doesn't automatically mean one half of full capacity, but that by law, we have to take spacing into account, etc. While some may feel very comfortable at this point in time, others truly do not, and we have to respect that and try to balance it.

Here at All Saints, 50% capacity equates to 325 people. In reality, after measuring 6 foot spacing in the pews and setting up extra chairs, we feel that we can reasonably accommodate 200 people while still maintaining proper social distancing. As long as the 6 foot social distancing recommendation is in place, 200 people will be the most we can accommodate, even if the percentage allowed increases. Ushers will be working diligently to seat larger families in the larger pews and singles and couples in smaller pews, etc. to make best use of our space.

We encourage those who choose to come to Mass to use the hand sanitizer available at the entrance, to wear face masks, and be mindful of keeping a 6 foot distance between you and those not in your household. These precautions are not only for your own protection, but also for the health of those around you.

It's also a good time to reiterate that it's important to not grow "lax" in keeping with the rules and parameters, as we don't want to "go backwards" in our ability to hold public Mass. People who have genuine concern about mixing in groups are still dispensed from Sunday Mass. We are still livestreaming the Sunday 10 AM Mass for those who wish to stay at home, and remind people that they are welcome to join us for Mass during the week when attendance is lower.

Most importantly, if you don't feel well, please stay home.

On June 12, Bishop Hying and Michael Lancaster, Superintendent of Catholic Schools, released a statement regarding the return to classes this fall. In part, the statement says,

Rest assured that all of our Catholic schools are planning to welcome students and teachers back to their regular classrooms this Fall for <u>in-person</u> instruction five days a week as scheduled. ... Our school principals have met weekly since March. Principals will meet throughout the summer as we consult local health officials to develop plans and protocols to reopen and operate each school safely and in a way that will allow us to provide the excellent faith formation and academic preparation that students deserve and on which parents depend. ... All plans and protocols will be based on the guidelines that have been released by the CDC and the state, as well as on the advice of local health officials and adapted for the unique situation of your Catholic school to best provide for the safety, education and formation of your child(ren).

Krista comes to us with a background that includes 23 years working in early education, community collaborations and leadership development, public speaking and a writer who most recently worked as a reporter. 

Recently I received a card from a woman in Boston, MA. Tucked inside was the article below, which she saw in the Catholic newspaper of the diocese of Portland, ME.

When I first arrived in Berlin, I was given several little grey mice dressed in various assortments of church vestments. Along with them was the history of how, when the Bishop consecrated th church and altar, a brave little mouse actually entered the sanctuary and scampered up one of the legs of the altar! (At least I think that's how the story goes.)

The Catholic Sentinel, newspaper of the Archdiocese of Portland, shares a recent letter it received to offer Catholic readers a little lighthearted break amid the seriousness of the coronavirus pandemic.

An open letter to Catholics from church mice:

Amid the pandemic, you have prayed for doctors, nurses, grocery store workers, priests and religious. You even, amazingly, invoke grace upon politicians before remembering us, who are right under your noses.

We church mice always made a good living from the Cheerios the Nelson kids dropped in the fourth pew during 10 a.m. Mass. And we realize the holy water was holy, but it also was delicious and refreshing. Now we are doing without, and you hardly seem to care.

Missing Holy Week was a big hit for us. In addition to the ecstasy of nibbling on succulent dropped palms, we consider Palm Sunday our most entertaining of the year. Those feisty Nelson boys call is "Sword Fight Sunday" and regularly thrill us with palmy parries and thrusts. We church mice refer to it as "Eye Poke Sunday" and would roll with laughter in our dens as we'd recount inadvertent facial assaults between pews. We guess those palms are hard to manage safely. Next year, best leave them on the ground for us. We'll take care of them.

Other than dodging drops of hot wax from all your little candles, we are impressed at your Easter Vigils. For the record, we prefer the dark part, since we must scamper into our holes when the lights come up. It's mouse code.

We may not have souls, but we can sense that something happens for you at Mass, something we don't notice in your houses, taverns and garages. For one thing, you almost never eat cheese puffs at church. For another, you seem connected to something bigger than you, a state we admire.

We may be only mice, but we hear when you say that your Christ is king of the universe, not just for humans. I guess Jesus is there for us all, even those who don't look like us—though tails and whiskers would be an improvement on you.
