Living with COVID at All Saints



We are starting to see some aspects of life returning to a more normal state of being. Children are back in school, businesses are open, and church services are being held. This is encouraging, and we ask our God that it may continue moving in that direction. However, (and the Diocese has reminded priests repeatedly) this is not a time to become complacent about safety measures that are required by both Church and State, in order to mitigate the spread of the

virus. I take this opportunity to again ask everyone to wear a mask, unless your health prohibits it. I realize there remains different feelings /opinions regarding this, so even though it may not be a concern for you, I ask you to wear it at Mass to help put others at ease. It takes the entire parish family working together, to keep this a welcoming place of worship where all people can feel safe and comfortable. I think we'd all agree this is something we want. I know you've heard it before, but the standard still applies: Please stay home if you are not feeling well. This is a time to be abundantly cautious for the sake of those you might come in contact with, especially the elderly and those who do not have a strong immune system. I see that most people are sanitizing their hands, wearing masks, and mindful of social distancing, and I thank you for that.

I extend additional gratitude to the women and men who volunteer their time sanitizing the pews and common areas after each Mass. This extra chore enables us to keep our doors open for Mass, private prayer, and other liturgies, and we have faithful people who quietly go about their work, making sure this is done. Your work does not go unnoticed. God bless.

In that same vein, if you are able to help with this, or other maintenance and cleaning at the church complex, even on an occasional basis, please call the office to let us know of your availability. These tasks include such things as: washing windows, dusting, sanitizing "high-touch" surfaces, and other "odd-jobs" as they pop up. As we look ahead to fall and winter months, this would also include people who can help with snow removal for the sidewalks and smaller areas at church. We appreciate all the parishioners for what they do to keep the Lord's House and grounds clean, neat, and safe. God bless.




Notes from our Principal Adjusting to school during Covid-19




