Looking Ahead.... To Christmas!



As we prepare for the Advent/Christmas Season, we need your help in gathering information regarding who will be attending Mass at All Saints Catholic Church for the celebration of The Nativity of our Lord on December 24th & December 25th.

We hope the COVID situation is much better by then, but we have no way of knowing that, so are approaching this as if we would still have a maximum capacity of 200 in the worship space. With that in mind, we are trying to determine whether adding an additional Mass will be necessary, and if so, what time would best accommodate people. We plan to have our usual Mass times as follows: <u>Thursday, December 24th</u> ~ 4:30 PM Children's Mass and 7:30 PM Mass <u>Friday, December 25</u> ~ 10:00 AM Christmas Morning Mass

Please fill out the following poll information to help determine if adding an additional Mass time would be helpful and the time that would be most beneficial. (We are considering adding either a 9:30 PM Mass on Christmas Eve *or* a midnight Mass on Christmas Eve.) Please fill in each part of the poll completely. We will no longer be accepting responses after Monday, October 5. We will then work on determining the Mass schedule Christmas Eve and Christmas based on the results. As we draw closer to Christmas, we will post the schedule, and then it will be necessary to register online or sign up in person for the Mass you plan to attend, and how many guests will accompany you. We understand some of that may be difficult to determine exactly, but we have to give our best prediction. We will keep you all informed as to how and when people are able to sign up.



Compassionate, gratuitous services available for divorced Catholics and those in irregular marriage situations

In an effort to improve our diocesan ministry to divorced Catholics and those in irregular marriage situations, our diocesan tribunal has expanded its services to include a Pre-Petition Case Advisor. A Pre-Petition Case Advisor accompanies an individual through the discernment process following a divorce by explaining the Church's teaching on marriage, making a personal assessment of any moral and canonical remedies available, and providing assistance in petitioning for a declaration of nullity (commonly referred to as an annulment).

Amy Klarkowski, previously the Moderator of the Tribunal Chancery for the Diocese of Madison from 2014-2019, has stepped into this role of Pre-Petition Case Advisor. If you or anyone you know has questions about marriage nullity or how to petition for a declaration of nullity, contact Ms. Klarkowski directly at (608) 821-3068 or send an email to amy.klarkowski@madisondiocese.org. The information you provide will be kept confidential and services are always at no cost to you.
