

Pope Francis announces 2021 the "Year of St. Joseph"

Pope Francis announced in a decree, that this will be a *Year of St. Joseph*. His announcement was made on December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. This coincides with the 150th anniversary of the saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church. The year of St. Joseph begins December 8, 2020, and concludes on December 8, 2021. Along with this decree, the Pope also issued an Apostolic Letter, entitled *Patris Corde* (With a Father's Heart), in which he shares some of his personal reflections on St. Joseph. Pope Francis says in his letter, "Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all."

After almost a year of worldwide pandemic, where our essential workers and volunteers have been the unsung heroes, St. Joseph is a very relevant saint for our times. The entirety of the letter can be read here:

In addition to the decree and letter, the Holy Father also set forth guidelines for the faithful to receive a plenary indulgence during this year of St. Joseph. A plenary indulgence is the remittance of all temporal punishment due to past sins that have already been forgiven. An indulgence can be gained for oneself, or for a soul in purgatory, but not for another living person. His Holiness, Pope Francis has set forth 15 different ways (prayers or good works) that the faithful can obtain a plenary indulgence during this year. Each one must be accompanied by the usual requirements of Sacramental Confession, receiving the Holy Eucharist, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions as soon as reasonably possible, along with a total detachment from sin.






Food for Thought:


