PARISH PRESS

December 8th is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is a holy day of obligation. It's important to understand what the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is, and what it is not. Some people think this feast day celebrates Christ's conception in Mary's womb by the power of the Holy Spirit, but that is the Incarnation. Others think the Immaculate Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was, but that, too, is incorrect. The Immaculate Conception means that Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin—or its effects. All human beings born after Adam and Eve, with the sole exception of Mary, are born with original sin, and without sanctifying grace. This means we are subject to the effects of original sin such as a weakened will. Therefore we are susceptible to temptations and commit sins. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings. We know this in part, because of the

Angel Gabriel's greeting to Mary when he says, "Hail, full of grace. The Lord is with you." Being "full of grace" implies that Mary had sanctifying grace all along. And that would not have been possible had she been conceived with original sin. But Mary too, was dependent on the redeeming act of Christ. By God's grace and the sacrifice her Son would make, Mary was granted this gift of grace **in advance**, making her womb a pure and worthy tabernacle for the Son of God.

CHRISTMAS MASS SIGN- UP

With Covid-19 still in our midst, this Advent and Christmas Season will present challenges when worshipping the Christ Child and celebrating His nativity. However, using the creativity God has given us, it also gives us the opportunity to do it in new and different ways! This year there will need to be a Christmas Mass Time Sign-Up to ensure we stay within our maximum capacity limits and prevent overcrowding We ask that parishioners only sign up for one Mass time to fulfill their Holy Day of obligation. Please include the total number of people that will be with you.

Below are the Signup Links for Christmas Mass Times. Each Mass time has its own sign up link. There will be only 200 spots available per Mass and will be first come first serve. If one Mass becomes full, we hope you will sign up for a different Mass time, even though you may not be the one you are used to attending. For those who do not have internet access to sign-up, we ask that family members assist each other in doing so, or you may call the parish to have a parish office team member assist you in signing up for a Mass time.
