

Purchasing a small quantity without the bulk pricing is cost prohibitive. (about \$18 each) So we did not purchase any extra Breaking Bread books for people to have/purchase from us. CHRISTMAS MASS INFORMATION

With Covid-19 still in our midst, this Christmas Season will present challenges when worshipping the Christ Child and celebrating His nativity. However, using the creativity God has given us, it also gives us the opportunity to do it in new and different ways! As you know, this year there is a Christmas Mass Time Sign-Up. This is to ensure we stay within our maximum capacity limits and prevent overcrowding.

There are only 200 spots available per Mass and have been filled on a first come first serve basis. Currently, all Masses except the 9:30 PM Mass on Christmas Eve have reached capacity. You can still register for this one by clicking on the link below as long as there are still spots available.

For those of you who will be participating from home, the <u>4:30 PM Christmas Eve Mass will be livestreamed</u>. You can watch this Mass live on our Facebook page the same way you would watch Sunday Mass. This Mass will also be recorded and posted to our website, www.allsaintsberlin.org, so that you can watch and participate in the Holy Mass at any time after the 4:30 Mass is over, at whatever time is most convenient for you.

Christmas Mass Safety Procedures

As we draw near to Christmas, we want to give people a picture of what we are planning to do to ensure social distancing and prevent overcrowding at the Christmas Masses. Most of our Masses have already reached their maximum capacity. Because of this, we will be making a seating chart with the names of those signed up for each Mass. This will help us use our space efficiently in addition to making sure that those who are on our list have a place to sit. Please understand that it will take some extra time for our ushers to seat everyone as each family will need to be escorted to their seats. We are asking that people plan to arrive early to Mass, even though you have pre -registered, to allow enough time for everyone to be seated before Mass begins. Doors will open 45 minutes before Mass, but please plan to arrive *no later* than 10 minutes before Mass begins. We are also asking that families who are sitting together plan to arrive together as well, to avoid confusion and to make everything flow as smoothly and quickly as possible.

In addition to the seating arrangements, we will be asking everyone to sanitize their hands as they enter church, and ask that everyone over the age of 5 wear a mask unless medically unable to do so.

We understand that this is not how we would normally do things, but we ask for your patience and grace as we do our best to accommodate everyone while adhering to the safety guidelines set forth by the government. We feel extremely blessed to be able to celebrate Mass in person this Holy Christmas season as we celebrate the birth of Christ and the hope that only He can give.
