## PARISH PRESS

### Pope Francis announces 2021 the "Year of St. Joseph"

Pope Francis announced in a decree, that this will be a *Year of St. Joseph*. His announcement was made on December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. This coincides with the 150th anniversary of the saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church. The year of St. Joseph begins December 8, 2020, and concludes on December 8, 2021. Along with this decree, the Pope also issued an Apostolic Letter, entitled *Patris Corde* (With a Father's Heart), in which he shares some of his personal reflections on St. Joseph. Pope Francis says in his letter, "Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all."



After almost a year of worldwide pandemic, where our essential workers and volunteers have been the unsung heroes, St. Joseph is a very relevant saint for our times. The entirety of the letter can be read here:

In addition to the decree and letter, the Holy Father also set forth guidelines for the faithful to receive a plenary indulgence during this year of St. Joseph. A plenary indulgence is the remittance of all temporal punishment due to past sins that have already been forgiven. An indulgence can be gained for oneself, or for a soul in purgatory, but not for another living person. His Holiness, Pope Francis has set forth 15 different ways (prayers or good works) that the faithful can obtain a plenary indulgence during this year. Each one must be accompanied by the usual requirements of Sacramental Confession, receiving the Holy Eucharist, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions as soon as reasonably possible, along with a total detachment from sin.

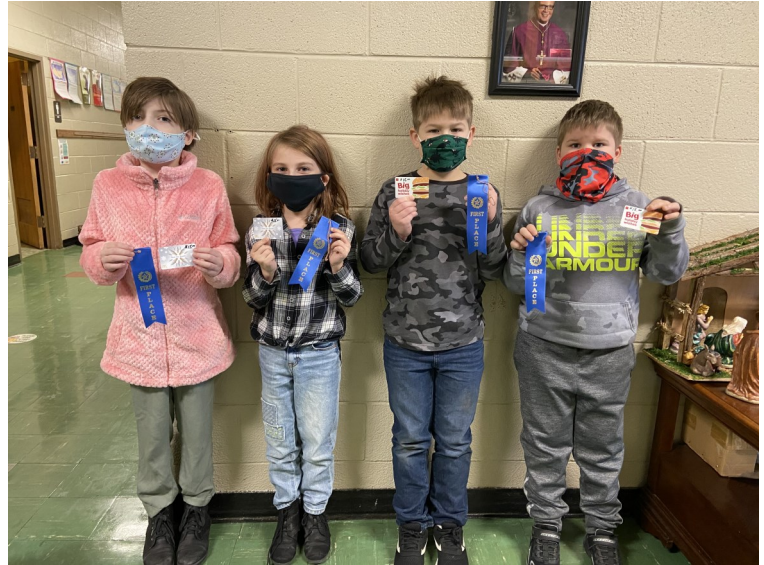
### What's Happening at All Saints Catholic School

# News and Announcements

## January is Pro-Life Month

With the anniversary of Roe v Wade on January 22nd, January is a month when we redouble our efforts in the pro-life movement. The USCCB has declared January 22 a National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, and there are many other worthwhile events and activities to get involved with. Look inside this bulletin for details on a collection of baby items, a “Baby Jesus Shower,” that you can participate in our very own parish. A couple of our parishioners have already taken part in a pro-life rally and share their experience below.

### March For Life Chicago—Moving the Movement

On January 2, 2021, Bonnie Lundt and Faye Grover, two of our parishioners, who are also board members of our local WI Right to Life chapter, attended the March for Life—Chicago “Moving the Movement” Rally. This year, due to Covid-19, the traditional March for Life Chicago Conference was transformed into a moving rally. The first stop was in Madison, WI, where cars parked in the Alliant Energy Center parking lot.



The members said it was a wonderful, motivating event, and they were blessed with great weather. After hearing from several speakers, all the cars participated in a drive-by rally around the State Capitol. Participants displayed pro-life posters as they drove around the Capitol a couple of times.

The key-note speaker at this event was Tory Peterson, who told her life story, *which did not end in abortion*. She was conceived through an act of violence, and her mother did consider abortion, but chose life instead. Tory's story is not a perfect one. She explained that she spent most of her childhood in foster care. Tory said both she and her mother believe that they saved each other's lives by choosing life. Because of her life experiences, she is a big advocate for supporting pro-life agendas. Tory stated that *God has a plan for everyone, and we must celebrate every life, no matter how it comes into the world*.

Such a powerful statement—one we should always remember as we advocate to end abortion!

Other speakers included Congressman Mike Gallagher of the 8th Congressional District, Congressman Bryan Steil of the 1st Congressional District, and others who spoke of programs that further the pro-life cause.

Participants learned that in the mid-west, there were 130,094 abortions, thus the rally is focusing on collecting as many diapers as there were abortions. The Madison rally collected 7000 diapers. The “Moving the Movement” rallies will continue to travel to Omaha, Fort Wayne, Mundelein, Indianapolis, and end in Chicago on January 23rd.

Next year the rally is scheduled for January 8, 2022. The WI Right to Life -Green Lake Chapter hopes to rally a big support from our community to continue to advocate for the right of all people, no matter how they come into the world, as God has a plan for each and every one of them.
