To qualify for the Special Needs Scholarship, an individual would have to have been previously identified by school district personnel with an educational disability, and has been determined to be in need of, or has received past educational services to address his or her needs. What's Happening at All Saints Catholic School



The children at All Saints Catholic School had a great cultural learning experience during Spanish class for Three Kings Day on Wednesday, January 6. It may seem different to think that Santa Claus isn't as popular in some households, however students learned that in Mexico and other countries across Latin America, the three wise men are the gift bearers, leaving presents for children and adults. On Wednesday, students celebrated with Rosca de Reyes, three kings' bread. A candied sweet bread, with a small baby figurine baked inside representing baby Jesus.



The dried fruit and candied fruit symbolize the crown of Kings, while the one who finds it in tradition will host a gathering on February 2 on Dia de La Candelaria, the end of the Mexican Christmas season. Cutting the bread represents that the danger of King Herod was to baby Jesus. The students were extremely engaged in learning about this tradition and were very eager to learn about how others celebrate the Christmas season.

Last week, the All Saints Catholic School kindergarten students started their science unit on octopi by making their own paper mâché octopus heads! Once dry, the students paint them and then they add the suckers onto the eight paper tentacles.

Students learned that octopi are amazing animals because they can make their bodies fit into small spaces, lay eggs, and can change color or shoot ink to protect themselves! It certainly was a fun week for our kindergarten students to work on their octopi project and learn more about this creature of the sea!
