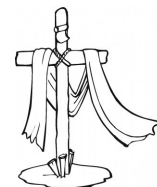

FAITH FORMATION



The Easter Vigil

I remember we went to the Easter Vigil once as a family when my siblings and I were quite young, not realizing what it was all about. I also remember my mom and dad remarking later that they'd never do that again with the kids because it was SOOOO long! So why is it so long?

This beautiful Mass has several different parts that aren't found in any other Masses.

First is the Liturgy of Light. The congregation waits in darkness, symbolizing the darkness after Christ was crucified. As we anticipate his rising again on Easter morning, a fire is lit and blessed, the new Easter candle is blessed and lit from it, and incense is blessed and lit. Then a solemn procession takes place and the Easter candle and smoking incense are brought forward. Everyone in the congregation waits with a small, unlit candle. As it proceeds towards the front of the church, the procession makes three stops, lighting the small candles of the person on the end of the pew, and the light is passed on until everyone's candles are lit. As the light slowly begins to fill the whole church, we are reminded that Christ, the Light of the World, dispels the darkness of our hearts and minds.

Next is the Liturgy of the Word. This part is somewhat familiar since it's a part of every Mass. Readings from the Old and New Testaments are proclaimed along with some psalms. The difference in the Easter Vigil is that there are more of them. There are at least 3, and up to 7 readings from the Old Testament that take us on a journey through salvation history. Then we hear a reading from one of the epistles and finally the Gospel reading which will recount the story of that first glorious Easter morning. The priest or deacon then gives a brief Easter message.

After this is the Liturgy of Baptism. Here the new baptismal waters are blessed. (If you remember, the baptismal font, and all holy water fonts, are emptied prior to the Good Friday service.) If there are any catechumens who have not previously been baptized, they will be baptized now, and the congregation will be asked to renew their baptismal vows. Catechumens coming into the Church through the RCIA program will also be Confirmed during this part of the liturgy. If there are no baptisms, there are usually a few parishioners who were never confirmed, and they do that now, at the Easter Vigil!

Finally the Liturgy of the Eucharist will be celebrated. This part should feel the most familiar as it is celebrated in much the same way as at every Mass. There may be special mention or attention given to those newly received into the Church if this is to be their First Communion, and for the Vigil, the Roman Missal includes the beautiful reading of the names of the Saints.

As an adult, I have come to love this Mass; I look forward to it each year. I feel deeply connected with the ancient rituals and rites that have been practiced by our fellow Christians for nearly 2,000 years. My husband and I have taken our own children to this Mass, (yes, on purpose, and yes they were a bit older) and they, too, have grown to love and appreciate this uniquely beautiful Mass.

IT'S GREAT TO BE CATHOLIC!

This year we have four Catechumens who will be Confirmed and received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. Please pray for them as they prepare their hearts for this special night, and that the Holy Spirit will remain with them and guide them as they continue their journey in faith.

The Apostolate for Persons with Disabilities Lenten Prayer Opportunity - On Monday evenings during Lent, Deacon Jim will be facilitating a discussion (NOT a homily) of the readings from the previous Sunday and two or three of the Stations of the Cross (we'll work our way through all 14 of them over 6 weeks). These Zoom sessions will take place at 6:00 pm and last about 45 minutes. Anyone who is interested is invited to participate and no pre-registration is needed. Here is the link:

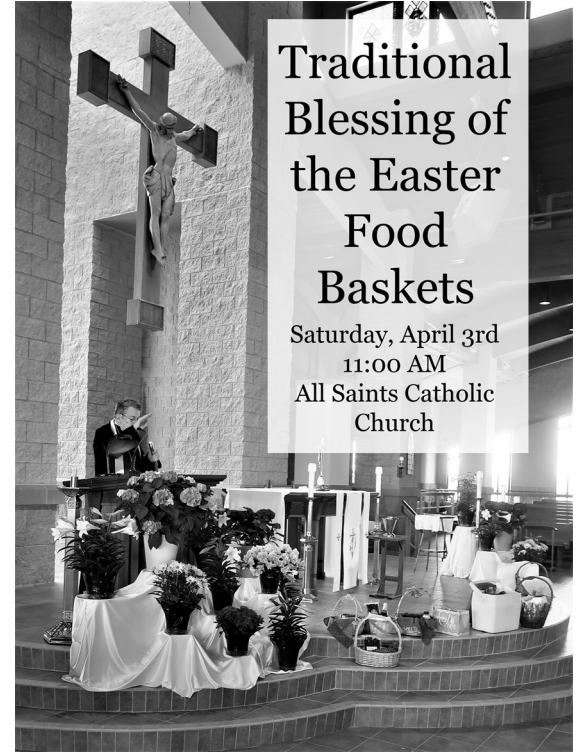

Blessing of Easter Baskets on Saturday, April 3 at 11:00 AM - When we hear the words "Easter Basket" a vision of colorful baskets filled with candy and delivered by a bunny might quickly come to mind. But the original Easter baskets contained food that would be blessed and shared as a feast on Easter Sunday.

Everyone is invited to take part in the custom of having an Easter basket blessed. This tradition originated over 700 years ago in Eastern Europe, and it is still cherished and practiced today particularly in Poland and in countries where there are people of Polish decent.

Called "Swieconka (Shfen-tsonka)" in Polish, the basket traditionally holds foods that have special symbolic meaning:

- Eggs represent new life and Christ's resurrection.
- Lamb represents Christ, the Lamb of God
- Bread represents Christ, the Bread of Life
- Ham represents joy and abundance. Also, since pork was forbidden by law in the Old Testament, it is also a reminder that all things are made new in Christ.
- Salt represents purification and reminds us that we are called to be salt of the earth.
- Horseradish represents the bitter sacrifice of Christ, and the bitter herbs used at Passover

Things other than food that have traditionally been included are:

a candle (unlit), representing that Christ is the Light of the World, an evergreen sprig of boxwood used as decoration and to represent everlasting life in Christ, and a clean white cloth to cover the basket, which represents Christ's burial cloth.

If you would like to be part of this ancient tradition, you can prepare a basket or box filled with a sampling of your Easter food (it need not contain foods or items listed above) and bring it to the church on Saturday, April 3 at 11:00 AM.

Father David will do a short, informal blessing. Parents, bring your children; this would be a great new (old) tradition to start with them.

Remember, Easter is not about the bunny; it's about the Lamb!
