If you're curious about the Catholic faith or you've thought about becoming a Catholic, our **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)** program is just for you. Adults from all faith traditions, or no religious background at all, are welcome to participate in our program of instruction designed especially for the needs and lifestyles of busy people. The program focuses on four essential areas: What the Church teaches (and why we believe it's the *fullness of the Truth*); How the Church teaches; The Bible; and Spirituality.

Is the Holy Spirit calling you to join Mother Church?

Bishop Hying is embracing the occasion of the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese of Madison in the year 2021, to launch a bold, robust evangelizing initiative. When we ponder the mission of the Church, it's clear that Jesus commands us to proclaim the Gospel to every creature—to be disciples ourselves and to make disciples of others. And that is what the Church has been about for 2,000 years. There is a special urgency to that task in this present moment, when we ponder the fact that, in any diocese in our country, roughly 70% of our baptized Catholics are not at church on any given Sunday. There's a myriad of reasons for that, but the bottom-line is, we need to do something about it. The task of evangelization is to proclaim in a fresh way and with a bold impulse the good news of Jesus Christ, of God's love for us, of the offer of salvation and forgiveness won for us by Jesus through his death and resurrection; to speak of Jesus as if people have never heard of him, because in many cases they really haven't, and so the Good News is both "Good" and really "New" for us.

The above paragraph, taken directly from the Diocese of Madison's website, describes the urgent need to share the Good News of Christ. How can we do that? How can you, as an individual do that? Bishop Hying has laid out a bold, four-part plan to help us both as a parish, and as individuals embrace God's love in our own lives, and radiate that love to others. Next week we will hand out booklets which go into detail on this initiative. It is actually a beautiful, but rather lengthy letter from the bishop, and due to paper and printing costs, the print is rather small. Therefore, we will also begin printing it section by section, in larger print, in the upcoming bulletins for the next month or two as well. This will also give everyone the opportunity to reflect on each section, one at a time. Are you ready? Let's go make disciples!

Phased Relaxation of Covid Restrictions

What follows is a brief summary of the timeline of events leading to cessation of diocesan Covid Mass guidelines and a return to normalcy.

- ◆ **Corpus Christi Sunday, June 5 & 6** - End of capacity limits in churches (unless local ordinances require it)
- ◆ **11th Sunday in Ordinary Time - June 12 & 13**
This will truly be a return to the ordinary with no further diocesan Covid related guidelines. Saturday, June 12 is the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, a fitting end to the Covid-19 restrictions! Congregational singing may resume, ushers no longer need to wear gloves or masks, Eucharistic ministers no longer need to wear masks during distribution of Holy Communion, etc. Parishes must continue to follow any local civil orders that could still be in place, and people are encouraged to continue to follow any CDC recommendations that would still be in place at this time.

We ask for God's continued healing presence in our lives, our country, and the whole world.

As you are all most likely aware, Father David will be retiring in July, and we would like to thank him and recognize his service to God and our parish by hosting a farewell reception for him. There will be light refreshments served and time to express your thanks and best wishes to Fr. David. The reception will be held in the social hall following the 10 AM Mass on July 11, which will be his last weekend Mass with us. Everyone is welcome!

You may also have questions about the new priests who will be coming. The brief biography below is from Fr. John Silva.

Father John Silva, age 43, grew up in the small, rural village of Snake Run, Indiana which is home to his parish, St. Bernard. He attended Holy Cross Catholic School and Gibson Southern High School in nearby Fort Branch, Indiana.



After high school, Father John received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota and attended major seminary at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Chicago, Illinois. He was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ on June 5, 2004. His decision to move north was due to the good friends he made from the seminary.

Father John's family includes his deceased mother who was a high school counselor for 48 years and his father, now semi-retired, who works on the family farm alongside his older brother. Fr. John's twin brother is an accountant who also lives near our family farm. He is the proud uncle of his five nieces and nephews.

Father John's past assignments were Sacred Heart Parish in Sun Prairie; Immaculate Heart of Mary, Monona; St. Luke, Plain; and Saint John, Spring Green.

Father John looks forward to bringing every parishioner to Jesus Christ and the Church by administering the sacraments, preaching the Word of God, and serving as a spiritual leader.
